What Authors Ought to Know

The Pediatric Infectious Disease Society of the Philippines (PIDSP) Journal has been in circulation since 1996. To this day, it remains to be indexed in the Western Region Pacific Index Medicus (WPRIM), the regional bibliographic index of medical journals published by Member States of the Region. A major target for the journal this year is the planned transition to an online manuscript submission and review system. E-REVIEWS or Enhancing Research Dissemination Via An Efficient Web-based Journal Management System is underway. Preparations for wider indexing is a not too distant project. As the journal committee continues to raise the bar with its timely and relevant publications, we perceive the need for a more comprehensive Publication Ethics and Publication Malpractice Guideline based on the Code of Conduct and Best Practice Guidelines for Journal Editors of the Committee on Publication Ethics. For this reason, the Journal Team is featuring the first of a series of guidelines related to ethics in medical publication to govern all stakeholders.

Author's Responsibilities

Authors are expected to submit an original manuscript after signing the **(1) PIDSP Journal Article Publishing Agreement (APA)**. The APA attests that (a) the submission has not been published and is not under simultaneous consideration elsewhere for publication (b) all co-authors have reviewed and approved of the manuscript (c) any potential conflict of interest, especially from any financial associations, will be fully disclosed (d) all sources of funding and institutional affiliations of authors will be indicated (e) if the study involved human subjects, informed consent were taken, or if minors, consent was obtained from their guardians (f) the research has been evaluated by an ethics board before the research was performed and (g) full copyright of the manuscript is assigned to the PIDSP Journal. Authors must also accomplish the **(2) International Committee of Medical Journal Editors (ICMJE) Disclosure Form**, which documents potential conflicts of interest for each author.

ICMJE Criteria for Authorship

The PIDSP Journal recognizes the 4 ICMJE criteria for authorship as follows:

1. Authors are only those with substantial contributions in the manuscript from conception, data acquisition, analysis and interpretation.



2. Authors are responsible for drafting the work or reviewing it critically.
3. Authors should approve of the final version to be published, and
4. Authors agree to be accountable for all aspects of their work.

Contributors who do not meet all 4 criteria for Authorship should not be listed as authors but should be acknowledged. The use of Artificial Intelligence for assistance in writing the manuscript should also be reported in the acknowledgement section. Lastly, Chatbots should not be listed as authors as they cannot be responsible for research accuracy and integrity.

We will continue to feature editor, reviewer and publisher's responsibilities in our next issues. Ignorance is no excuse.
